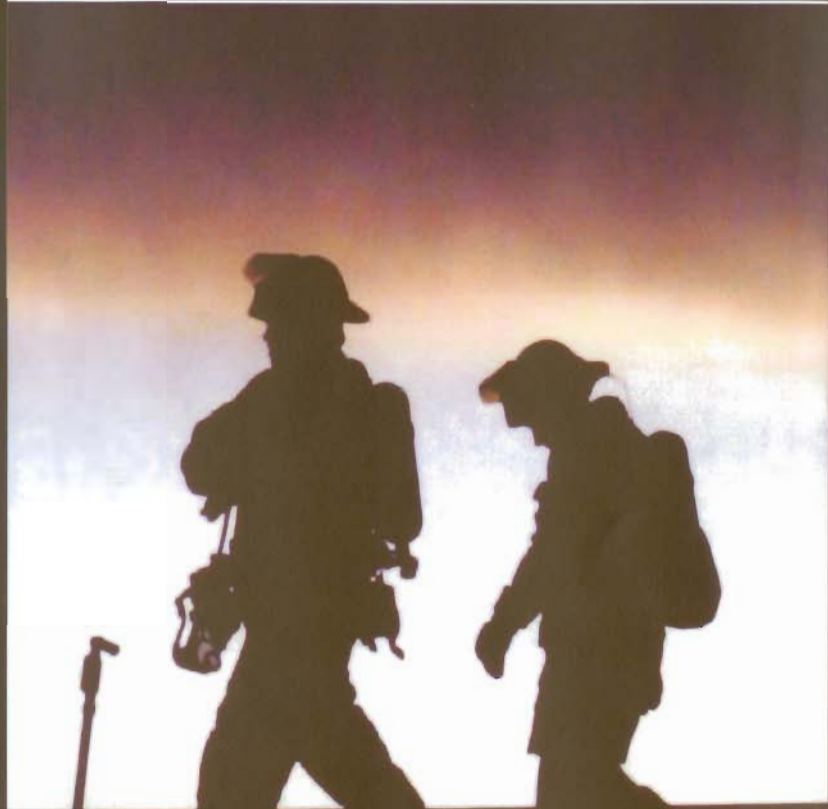


IAFF ALWAYS ON THE FRONTLINE

The IAFF Alumni Association was formed with passage of Resolution 40 at the 2002 IAFF Biennial Convention. Resolution 40 created a new opportunity for retirees to stay connected to the IAFF. All retired members who are in good standing with their local union are automatically enrolled into the Alumni Association.

Active-Retired members who pay half-dues receive the International Fire Fighter magazine at no cost. The bi-monthly International Fire Fighter is the primary means of communication with rank-and-file members on IAFF initiatives, trends and developments in the fire service, legislative issues and other information relevant to IAFF members and retirees.

Retired members who do not participate in their local union's Active-Retired membership are not eligible to become a part of the Alumni Association.

Retired members from locals without Active-Retired status have the opportunity to purchase the International Fire Fighter magazine for \$18 per year.

Alumni members can take advantage of many IAFF benefits. From health, auto and home insurance to the purchase or refinancing of a new or existing home, the IAFF Financial Corporation is available to assist Alumni members.

With membership in the Alumni Association, you have access to the member's only section of the IAFF web site where you can stay up to date on the latest local and national news as it relates to our proud union.

The Alumni online store offers a variety of retiree merchandise including polo style shirts, hats, lapel pins, car window decals and championship rings.

IAFF members approaching retirement can expect new programs and initiatives in the near future. We are actively pursuing a partnership with Union Sportsman Alliance (USA) that will provide reduced membership fees for all Alumni participants.
